November is The Rotary Foundation Month and we are fortunate to have High-Rise member and Past President Susan Rix talking this week about the work of the Foundation, including how the personal investments we make come back to us in the form of Global or District Grants that in turn support our own Club projects.

This is yet another example of how, collectively, Rotary improves the lives of so many. On the other hand I am reminded that it takes just one person to initiate great projects. In Rotary it was Arch Klumph who established The Rotary Foundation; Clem Renouf from the Nambour Rotary Club, RI President in 1978/79, spearheaded the Polio eradication campaign; and a US Rotarian, James Bomar, raised funds and organised the first vaccination of around \$6,000,000 children in the Philippines. Just think of the lives saved by the initiative of these three Rotarians.

Speaking of initiative, it was in 2009 that Bill Phillips introduced our annual flutter on the Melbourne Cup, the Trifecta, which to date has raised a total of around \$30,000 for our Club projects. That is an amazing total Bill so thank you and thank you to all members for contributing so willingly. My philosophy is that if we are going to lose on the Cup anyway the money is better in the Club than the TAB. At the time of writing no one has come forward with this year's winning ticket. If you haven't opened them yet, go now and check.

And here is a new way to save some money, through the new Rotary Global Rewards with discounts on travel, entertainment and much more.
