

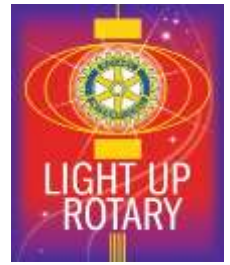

Hon Dr Jo Lusi, MD

Orthopaedic Surgeon
HEAL Africa Hospital
Goma, DR Congo
Co-Founder of HEAL Africa

Dr. Lusi received his orthopaedic training and accreditation in Belgium after completing his undergraduate medical degree at the University of Kirohasa, DRC.

He returned to Nyankunde Mission Hospital, working there as an orthopaedic surgeon for nineteen years. In 1993, while based in Nairobi, Kenya, he became the Director of Health Development for MAP International, coordinating medical care throughout Africa.

After the 1994 Rwandan genocide, Dr Lusi was requested to develop a medical service in Goma, as many had fled across the border from Rwanda to the Goma area. In 1996 he (together with his late wife Lyn) established the HEAL Africa Hospital and HEAL Africa Organisation specifically to train young Congolese doctors to better serve their own community.

Together Dr Lusi and Lyn also established significant community development work in eastern DRC. He served as a Senator in the Interim Congolese Government after peace was declared in 2003.

Dr Lusi is credited with championing the rights of women and the fight against 'sexual violence as a weapon of war'. He remains actively involved in HEAL Africa Hospital and continues his vision and passion for improving healthcare in eastern Congo.

Dr. Justin Lussy is the CEO of HEAL Africa DRC. He is also a qualified Obstetrician and Gynaecologist.

As the very first resident doctor with HEAL Africa Hospital's Family Medicine residency program in the year 2000, he has spent a significant amount of time mentoring many of the resident doctors who later joined the residency program. He completed his Master's Degree in Family Medicine from the University of Limpopo (South Africa).

In an effort to fill a need for an Obstetric and Gynaecological specialist to deal with the challenges of rape and vaginal fistulae in the eastern part of the DR Congo, Dr. Justin trained and received O&G accreditation at Makerere University in Uganda.

He now heads the O&G department at HEAL Africa Hospital and is particularly involved in fistula repair throughout the eastern provinces of DRC.

His skills in this area have been further developed through working with gynaecologists who have been part of AusHEAL teams.
