Continuing the September Basic Education and Literacy theme I am delighted to announce that \$5000 was forwarded to the MKUU Rombo Rotary Club to complete the Mamba Primary School Library. The work to be undertaken will also include preparation for installation of electricity to the site which is the last of our planned building projects. Over five years we have put the bricks and mortar in place but what we are really doing is enabling those 420 children plus future students to develop effective communication, become independent readers and lifelong learners. Just think back to the dirt floors and open sided classrooms of a few years ago and how few dollars, in our terms, it takes to achieve so much.

To stretch the dollars raised by our club we successfully applied for Rotary Global Grants and partnered with the Rotary Club of Mkuu Rombo. It is a requirement of the Grant Scheme to involve the local community; a wise move on the part of Rotary as there a sense of pride and ownership that will sustain the project into the future. At Mamba school we see that pride in the warm welcome given to High-Rise members when they visit the school and the student's joy in proudly showing their work. I have reprinted on the next page a letter to Bill Phillips from Kimario, our Mkuu Rombo Rotary partner, outlining the preparations for the Library. They are prepared and ready to go.

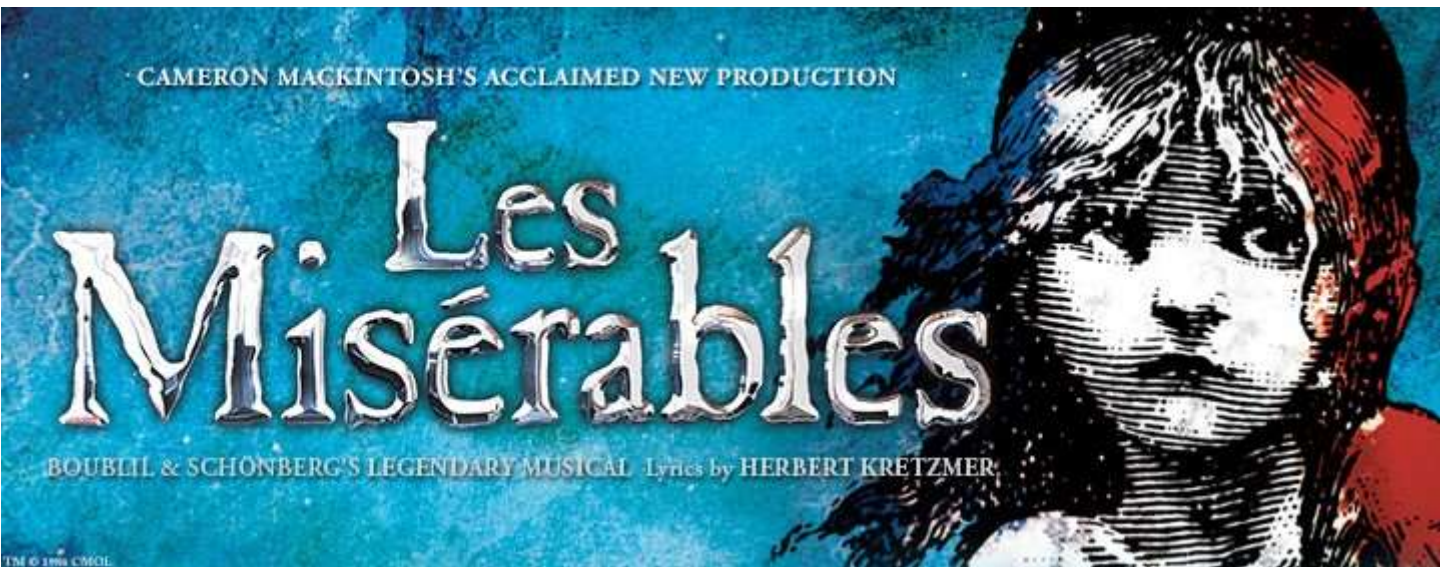
