

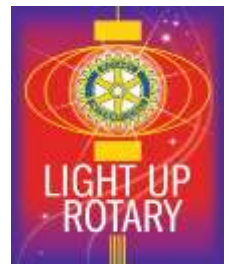

### LINDSAY'S LINES

Years after I joined Rotary, I vaguely recall a girl speaking to our club who was applying (unsuccessfully) for selection to the National Youth Science Forum (NYSF). It wasn't until 2006 when my daughter Lisa applied, and only after prompting from a girl at her school, that I became fully aware of NYSF. When Lisa was selected to attend NYSF07, as our club's first successful candidate, my wife and I didn't even know Lisa would be away in Canberra for a full 2 weeks the following January. After her return, it wasn't hard to realise what an extraordinary Rotary Youth Program NYSF is – providing a training camp for the future leaders in the sciences at an significantly influential time of their lives.

As we found over the next few years, selection is difficult with the vast number of amazing students all vying for a limited number of places so it took until NYSF11 before our club gained our next successful nominees. I must say that, as a club, we are very fortunate in the amazing students that our club have been privileged to nominate as reflected by the 100% success rate since NYSF11 and the 9 successful candidates in the 9 years since 2007.

One area I believe NYSF excels: EVERY year I hear of and see a clearly discernible positive change in the students post NYSF – the confidence they display, the maturity they appear to gain (virtually overnight) and the enthusiasm they engender. This again was clearly evident when Kallum Strachan spoke to us last week about his time at this year's NYSF. Our future certainly looks bright when these young people become our leaders.

Don't forget, if you know any year 11 students who are passionate about the sciences, have them apply to NYSF16 no later than May15.

# Anzac 2015 Update

Traditional hand skills used to reproduce the replica MAHENO Bell for the ANZAC Centenary.

Fourth generation of the well known Maryborough business Olds Engineering, Dr. William Olds (PhD) uses a specially made cold chisel and ball peen hammer to carefully cut the letters "MAHENO" while sitting on an original seat from Ship.

The ornate swivelling chair was salvaged from the World War One Hospital Ship Maheno after she grounded on Fraser Island.



The treasured seat is one of 3 now belonging to Granville resident Mr John Walker who is pictured studying the marking detail. In the foreground is the original ship's bell which was sent over from the Maheno School in the South Island of New Zealand for reproduction.

William's great grandfather (also William) served with his two brothers during the Great War and started in business in 1918 after returning home.
