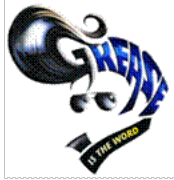

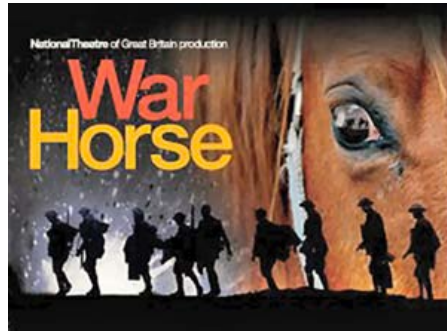

The Final Three

Pakistan - 8 Polio Cases recorded in 2013 compared to 16 on this date in 2012, with the most recent case reported on April 24, 2013. No new Type 3 Polio cases have been reported in over one year in Pakistan. Rotary has installed mobile clinics at toll plazas to reach migrant populations with the oral polio vaccine. On average, 1,000 – 8,000 children now receive the vaccine on a daily basis.

Afghanistan - 2 Polio Case recorded in 2013 compared to 6 on this date in 2012, with the most recent case reported on March 28, 2013. Sub-National Immunization Days are planned for late May in high-risk areas.

Nigeria - 22 Polio Cases recorded in 2013 compared to 30 on this date in 2012, with the most recent cases (from the Kano, Borno, Taraba, & Yobe areas) reported on April 24, 2013. Sub-National Immunization Plus Days were held this past week using Bivalent (Type 1 & 3) Polio vaccine. Rotary members from the polio-free southern region of the country are helping to monitor immunization campaign in the polio-affected northern region.
