MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT – Bill's Blurp

It is certainly nice to be back and into the swing of things of Club activity. Much yet to do and the year is rapidly disappearing. Where has the time gone? Before giving emphasis to our remaining priorities I wanted to comment again on my recent trip to Tanzania. I mentioned last week about the visit to the Mamba Primary School. This week I would like to focus on St Judes. The two schools are a complete contrast. Mamba has few facilities; what they have are very basic; there isn't even electricity so the lighting is poor and there are no computers; the teaching standards I suspect are pretty ordinary; the school grounds are a health and safety nightmare. St Judes has wonderful facilities; they measure up reasonably well to Australian standards; the equipment and resources are available to support the needs of all children; yes there is electricity with back up generators; the school grounds are pleasant and safe and the teaching standards are rising all the time. The school has stepped aside from the Tanzanian curriculum and adopted international standards and is training the teachers to this standard. While we were there a bunch of volunteer teacher mentors from Australia were running a month long training program for all the lower grade teachers. It makes sense doesn't it that the educational outcome will only be as good as the educational input most of which comes from the teachers.

Since taking on the first three students in 2002 St Judes now has 1,500 kids enrolled. The first intake has two more years to go to finish their schooling. There is now focus on establishing a program to take the matriculating kids through university. There is no government funding supporting St Judes. All the money for the new buildings required each year to take the next intake of 150 children plus the running costs which include facilities for boarding all kids from grade four onwards comes from donations. Most of this money is from Australia and a very high proportion has a Rotary connection. The story of St Judes is amazing. One woman, Gemma Sisia, with a dream turned into reality in a relatively short space of time through sheer hard work, determination and brilliant organisational skills. She did all this and still found time to become a Mum (x 3 with one on the way). It is a humbling experience to meet Gemma and see St Judes.

There is much I could say about this school. We will hear first hand on the 15th March as we have Gemma's 2IC and a Director, Kim Saville, as our guest speaker. It was meant to be Gemma but her pregnancy means that she is precluded from making the trip. Kim is a great stand in as she has been there just about from Day 1. She has lived St Judes for the last 10 years. Just as St Judes is a great story in itself so too is it a great Rotary story. Not only have members and Clubs provided financial support but there is a regular procession of volunteers to the School from Clubs all round Australia. There is now even a designated Rotary room at the School for relaxation and dining. I was pleased to add our banner to those hanging around the room. You could hardly describe our little group as volunteers; we didn't do much other than stand back and admire. But there are a few more people now hooked on St Judes; the more that are and the more that the message is spread the easier will the fund raising effort be to sustain the school. Let me know if it is of interest to you to become an active supporter of St Judes.

WANTED: VOLUNTEER CO-ORDINATOR FOR A ROMAC-LIKE PROJECT

Most Rotarians are aware of the multi-district program known as ROMAC (Rotary Overseas Medical Aid for Children), which brings children under 15 from developing countries for medical and surgical treatment in Australia. High-Rise has long been a good supporter of ROMAC, both at the club and district level, e.g. the Art Show. Several High-Risers have often indicated willingness to being part of ROMAC activities. However, from time to time patients older than 15 are referred to us; often with defects which, although complex, are still potentially treatable. One such case is a 22 year old lady named Ayaan, from Somaliland, who has a significant facial defect as a consequence of being hit in the face with a piece of bullet shrapnel during their civil war with Somalia 20 years ago. The treatment will be quite complex, and will involve a number of different specialists and disciplines. Although she is not eligible for treatment through ROMAC, a number of doctors have offered their expertise, and Wesley hospital has indicated they will offer their facilities, free of charge. The hospital and doctors in Somaliland have raised the costs of the airfares to Australia. However, what is needed is a "Project Co-ordinator/Supervisor" who can organise all the administrative aspects, of air-line bookings, visa applications, transport to appointments while in Australia, co-ordination with an expatriate host family, etc, -there are lots of 't's to be crossed, and i's to be dotted'!

NB. No medical expertise is required, and all liaison with medical providers will be arranged separately.

If any High-Risers are interested in volunteering themselves for such an activity, or simply wish to find out more info, please let me know.
