Since January 2010, the Dress for Success program assisted over 2,000 women from the Greater Brisbane area and during 2012, services were extended to men. All clothes (corporate, casual and formal attire) in good condition are appreciated. However, in particularly strong demand are:

- For women -** Suits (jackets and trousers) in smaller and larger sizes (6-8 / 16+)
- Shoes – closed toes
- Handbags – particularly black
- Unused makeup
- For men -** Shirts, trousers and suit jackets (all sizes needed but especially sizes 2XL+)
- Shoes
- Ties
- Belts - particularly black
