The geographical variation ranges from beautiful coastal beaches (both in Kenya and Tanzania), to Mt. Kilimanjaro, highest mountain in Africa, and Lake Victoria, largest fresh water lake in Africa. The Big Five - lion, leopard, elephant, rhino and buffalo - still roam the vast savannahs and bush land. The total population of all five countries is about 130 million in an area of 3,139,000 sq kms.
