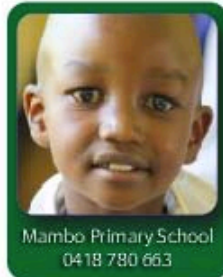

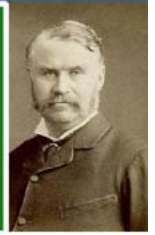

Tubes are slowly being removed and they expect him to remain in ICU until Monday when hopefully he will go to one of the "Normal" wards.
