MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT – Bill's Blurp

One of the good things about the last year for me has been the encouragement/opportunity to attend Rotary functions outside our Club. This includes attending meetings of other Clubs. And so it was that I attended the dinner meeting of the Rotary Club of Mt Isa during my recent visit to the city.

This was a most enjoyable occasion; the members were welcoming and hospitable and the food was just about the best I have had at a Rotary meeting anywhere. This club runs some interesting projects in keeping with the nature of the community they serve e.g. the drovers festival in Camooweal; they had a meeting there recently which finished in minus 17 minutes. What they did was start the meeting on the QLD side of the border and finished it on the NT side so gaining half an hour. Took me a while to work that one out.

Of great interest to me was their major project of the year; it is the Mt Isa Rodeo. The Club has run this event for 53 years; it turns over about \$1m and the prize money is the best offered by any rodeo anywhere in the world. That includes the Calgary Stampede. Not bad! As a consequence the rodeo gains global exposure which in turn means so does Rotary.

To run the event the club employs a full time manager and a part time assistant. The expected profit each year is \$150K.

Associated with the rodeo is an art union also run by the club. There are 2,200 tickets sold at \$100 each. All tickets are normally sold well in advance of the draw; the first prize is a Toyota landcruiser and second is a camry or something similar. (It made me think of the struggle we have to sell our trifecta tickets at \$2 each.)

The Mt Isa Club has about 25 members of which maybe one third are women. For such few numbers they sure have an impact on their community and beyond. They have a bit of an impact on each other too if the Sergeant's session is anything to go by. They don't miss anyone including visiting Rotarians!

There is a good spirit in the club if my experience is anything to go by. Their meetings are more formal than the way we run ours but there seems to be still a strong sense of fun. Isn't that just so important?

Well its back to normal this week; for me anyway. I was pleased to hear that the joker draw did not go off while I was absent. I want to be there for the excitement. This is an appropriate time to thank Karen for organising this important little fund raiser. She has been doing that for years. And it is very much appreciated.


Last year was the first time we ran it, and it was a very, very successful day. However the main thrust came from Clubs and their members.

ROTARY FOUNDATION – UPDATE

Clean water. Rotarians put 1,250 bio sand filters into homes in the Dominican Republic through a US\$150,000 project supported by a Rotary Foundation Grant. This undertaking was part of the Children's Safe Water Alliance, a project of District 4060 that helped bring 19,000 filters — and clean water — to 100,000 people in 300 communities in just seven years.

Water and sanitation. Every day, 5,000 children under age five die from unsafe water and poor sanitation and hygiene. Past RI President William B. Boyd says: — “It is true that water is life, and it is also sadly true that too many people have no access to clean, safe, drinkable water. Rotary has the expertise and the worldwide membership to save lives by providing pota-ble water on a large scale.”

Humanitarian Grants. Your contribution to the Annual Programs Fund can literally be the bridge to a better life for people in need. In El Salvador, a US\$17,600 Grant project built three bridges that improved the lives of approximately 2,500 people. The bridges increased agricultural trade, economic growth, and access to health care and education. An unexpected benefit: during excavation a high-quality water source was discovered which residents can now access — by crossing the bridge.

District News

In March The Rotary Foundation Trustees approved a one year pilot of the Project Enhancement Process (PEP) to begin on 1 July 2012. The purpose of PEP is to strategically utilise Rotary's volunteer and staff resources to sharpen Rotary's focus, enhance the technical quality of projects, support sound project design, make effective grants, and measure impact in the areas of focus. The pilot will concentrate on achieving these objectives within the water and sanitation area of focus.

As part of the pilot, we will identify ten Future Vision pilot districts to serve as PEP “host districts”. Rotarians in these districts will have the opportunity to utilise the PEP resources during the 2012-13 Rotary Year.

While utilisation of these and other resources will not be required of host districts, the PEP pilot pre-sents a unique opportunity for participants to access financial and technical resources for enhanced project planning and sustained project results. In addition, utilisation of these resources is expected to decrease the amount of communication with TRF necessary prior to global grant approval, thereby creating a more efficient application process.

I am pleased to invite your district to participate as one of the ten host districts for the 2012-13 PEP pilot. The Water and Sanitation Rotarian Action Group (WASRAG) has been identified as a key ally in piloting the PEP concept. Acceptance of this invitation to serve as a PEP host district will also grant permission to WASRAG to contact Rotarians in your district regarding PEP. We are finalising plans for several in-person and on-line training sessions for PEP host districts, and will soon share with you detailed information. Please encourage representatives from your district attending the RI Convention in Bangkok to attend these PEP training opportunities. I also encourage you or your designees to visit the WASRAG booth in Bangkok to learn about the support and resources they can provide.

Thank you very much for your thoughtful consideration of this invitation. I am delighted to be a part of this exciting initiative and hope your district will participate. Sincerely, John Hewko
