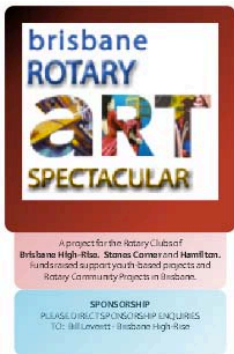

Colin Beckett is seeking donations to support Julia Semese a Grade 11 student at Peter Claver High School in Maokeng who needs an electric wheelchair. At the age of ten, Julia underwent a surgical procedure that left her without the permanent use of her legs. Julia currently relies on an ordinary wheelchair which severely limits her independence.

The school has approached the Rotary Club where Colin is President to help with the procurement of a motorised wheelchair for Julia – the cost will be in the region of R20,000.00 (approx AU\$2,350). Over the last few months his Rotary club has nurtured the development of an Interact club at the Peter Claver High School. 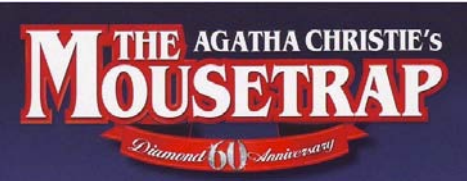

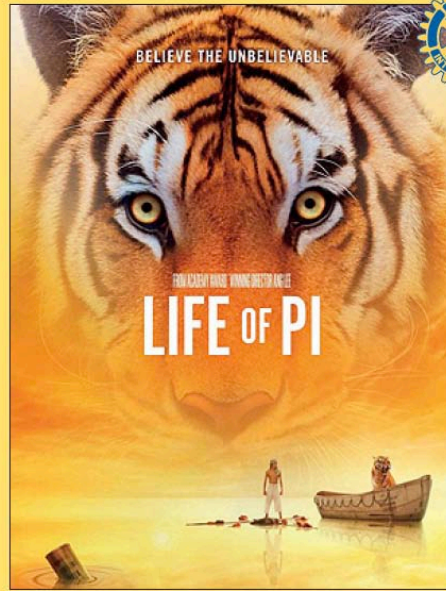
