There was no time for school. With our sponsorship he is now attending the Children's Welfare Centre where he is well cared for and getting a good education. Thanks everyone. 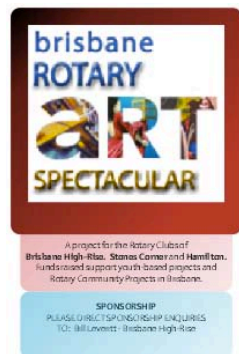
