WANTED: VOLUNTEER CO-ORDINATOR FOR A ROMAC-LIKE PROJECT

Most Rotarians are aware of the multi-district program known as ROMAC (Rotary Overseas Medical Aid for Children). High-Rise has long been a good supporter of ROMAC, both at the club and district level. However, from time to time patients older than 15 are referred to us; often with defects which, although complex, are still potentially treatable. One such case is a 22 year old lady named Ayaan, from Somaliland. What is needed is a "Project Co-ordinator/Supervisor" who can organise all the administrative aspects, of air-line bookings, visa applications, transport to appointments while in Australia, co-ordination with an expatriate host family, etc. - there are lots of 't's to be crossed, and i's to be dotted! NB. No medical expertise is required, and all liaison with medical providers will be arranged separately.
