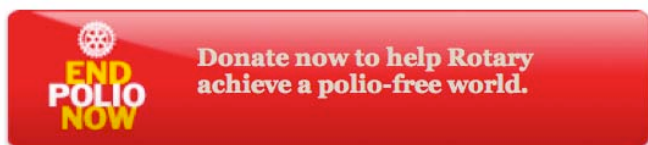

NAURU JOINS THE ROTARY CLAN

The Board of Rotary International has accepted a submission to encompass the Republic of Nauru into the family of Rotary. This new nation in Rotary has been assigned to Rotary District 9600, in Zone 8, for administration. Nauru is to be the 215th (?) nation where Rotary will be giving Service above Self. Once officially notified to RI South Pacific and Philippines Office an application to charter a Rotary Club in Nauru will be activated. The application is already held in RISPPPO ready to be accepted, with the signatures of 28 potential charter members. This is indeed an historic day within Rotary, and of course District 9600.

The next step is charter a Rotary Club in Nauru.

We have a DG's Special representative appointed: RID John Lawrence.

We have a Sponsor Club: Rotary Club of Brisbane Planetarium.

We have a planned meeting location: Rooms within the University of the South Pacific.

We have a provisional committee: Potential Club President, Secretary, Treasurer and Sergeant-at-Arms have been elected.

We have sufficient members to charter a Club: We currently we have 28 potential members, already registered and willing to charter members.

Further all members have already paid their Chartering dues, (this money is held in trust in anticipation of the Chartering of a Club in Nauru). Gifts from Clubs/Districts will be sort shortly to present on Chartering night of the newest Club in our District and in our Zone.
